Why Do We Do What We Do?

We're a small, active church. But if you pause for a minute, you may wonder why we do all the things we do. What is the theology behind our activity? The answer becomes clear when we look back at some of our activities in February and look ahead to March.

Here are some things we did in February:

- We held our third Family Worship. In addition to eating pancakes, Emma Murphy and Morgan Van Liew helped young people learn the Loaves and Fishes Bible Story. What's more important than helping young people learn what it means to be a Christian?
- We also helped our Scouts in Troop 46 "be reverent," which is part of their Scout oath. It was great to have many Scouts and leaders from our community in worship on February 7.
- We joined in Lenten reflection, as we remembered the sacrifice made by Christ for the remission of our sins.
- In addition to food, we shared hospitality and fellowship at our Pot Luck Luncheon.
- We also honored Mait Van Nostrand, who did so much for our church, by dedicating the sound system to his memory. It is important to remember those who have helped make us who we are.
- During this month, we collected a large amount of pasta and sauce to help replenish the Montgomery Food Bank.

March holds promise for continued meaningful events.

- We will hold another Family Worship, encouraging more families to learn about God through the story of the Good Samaritan.
- We will invite the ladies of Crawford House to join us in Cook Hall for an afternoon of soup-making and fellowship.
- We will also grow and learn when Mimi Coffey helps us understand Islam on March 6, and the following week when our partners at Marble Collegiate present a program on giving our gifts.
- On Maundy Thursday, we will join in worship and communion with our brothers and sisters in Christ from Griggstown Reformed.
- And, on Easter Sunday, we will welcome community to our church as we celebrate Christ's resurrection. This is the most important day of our year, and helping others understand Christ's death and resurrection is critical to our mission.

What we do is not just for us. It is to help us and others remember the Great Commandment to love God and love our neighbors. This can happen in a variety of ways, but we need to remind ourselves that our activities are purposeful and pleasing to God.

Bring some food, bring a friend, bring yourself, and join the fun at our final winter Pot Luck on March 13.


Ovens will be on low heat during worship if you want to keep your dish warm during the service.
